



Alpbach Declaration on the Future of Europe

We, the Ministers and State Secretaries responsible for European Affairs of Austria, Greece, Hungary, Ireland and Spain have gathered in Alpbach to discuss the future of the European Union. In the spirit of the European Forum Alpbach, we engaged in discussing current challenges. We carefully listened to each other in order to understand the various perspectives and ideas. Cyprus and the Czech Republic subsequently expressed their support and joined this Declaration.

We strive to overcome today's major challenges such as climate change, migration, terrorism and the repercussions of COVID-19 together. We have a common interest in a European Union that is internationally competitive, promotes common values, has a strong voice in the world, and sustainable and innovative economies.

Naturally, opinions on how to achieve our objectives may diverge. It is however clear that we can only succeed if we act in a spirit of unity.

The European Union will be successful as long as it listens to the citizens. We therefore reaffirm the importance of the Conference on the Future of Europe.
